The Seven Dying Words of Jesus

THE FIRST WORD: "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do." Luke 23:34

THE SECOND WORD: "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." Luke 23:43

THE THIRD WORD: "Jesus said to his mother: "Woman, this is your son." Then he said to the disciple: "This is your mother." John 19:26-27

THE FOURTH WORD: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Matthew 27:46 and Mark 15:34

THE FIFTH WORD: "I thirst." John 19:28

THE SIXTH WORD: When Jesus had received the wine, he said, "It is finished;" and he bowed his head and handed over the spirit. John 19:30

THE SEVENTH WORD: Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." Luke 23:46

The Prayers and the Lord's Prayer

The Stripping of the Altar as Psalm 22 is Read Responsively (signifying the preparation of Jesus for burial)

- P. My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from saving me, from the words of my groaning? *C. O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer, and by night, but I find no rest.*
- P. Yet you are holy, enthroned on the praises of Israel. *C. In you our fathers trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them.*
- P. To you they cried and were rescued; in you they trusted and were not put to shame. *C. But I am a worm and not a man, scorned by mankind and despised by the people.*
- P. All who see me mock me; they make mouths at me; they wag their heads; *C. "He trusts in the Lord; let him deliver him; let him rescue him, for he delights in him!"*
- P. Yet you are he who took me from the womb; you made me trust you at my mother's breasts. *C. On you was I cast from my birth, and from my mother's womb you have been my God.*
- P. Be not far from me, for trouble is near, and there is none to help. *C. Many bulls encompass me; strong bulls of Bashan surround me;*
- P. they open wide their mouths at me, like a ravening and roaring lion. *C. I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint; my heart is like wax; it is melted within my breast;*
- P. my strength is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to my jaws; you lay me in the dust of death.
- C. For dogs encompass me; a company of evildoers encircles me; they have pierced my hands and feet—
- P. I can count all my bones— they stare and gloat over me; *C. they divide my garments among them, and for my clothing they cast lots.*
- P. But you, O Lord, do not be far off! O you my help, come quickly to my aid! *C. Deliver my soul from the sword, my precious life from the power of the dog!*
- P. Save me from the mouth of the lion! You have rescued me from the horns of the wild oxen! *C. I will tell of your name to my brothers; in the midst of the congregation I will praise you:*
- P. You who fear the Lord, praise him! All you offspring of Jacob, glorify him, and stand in awe of him, all you offspring of Israel! *C. For he has not despised or abhorred the affliction of the afflicted, and he has not hidden his face from him, but has heard, when he cried to him.*
- P. From you comes my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will perform before those who fear him. C. The afflicted shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek him shall praise the Lord! May your hearts live forever!
- P. All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the Lord, and all the families of the nations shall worship before you. *C. For kingship belongs to the Lord, and he rules over the nations.*
- P. All the prosperous of the earth eat and worship; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust, even the one who could not keep himself alive. *C. Posterity shall serve him; it shall be told of the Lord to the coming generation;*
- P. they shall come and proclaim his righteousness to a people yet unborn, that he has done it!

<u>The Strepitus</u> (The strepitus, or closing of the book, signifies and reminds us of the earthquake that struck as Jesus died. The Christ candle leaves the church to signify His burial)
