Ash Wednesday Reflections

February 26 is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the 40-day period (excluding Sundays) that ends with Easter Sunday.

Across the land, Christians from various denominations will commemorate the day by fasting, praying or participating in ceremonies in which ashes are crossed on their foreheads. Many will abstain from a particular food, beverage or activity until Easter, in recognition of Jesus' great sacrifice.

These rituals symbolize our connection to God and our acknowledgment that despite being created in His image, we are mere mortals who sin and mess up more often than we get it right.

What I enjoy most about this season is the opportunity it gives us to publicly embrace our shortcomings, or at least recognize the fact that we often don't measure up, faith wise.

In our "survival of the fittest," "may the best man (or woman) win" society, it's not easy to admit that you're not perfect.



Most of us know that perfection is impossible in human form, but let the tabloids, news magazine shows and celebrity profiles tell it, perfection can be bought in a bottle or Botox needle, discovered in a therapist's chair or molded on a personal trainer's gym floor mat. 

Ash Wednesday is the best way to begin the Lenten Season

Ash Wednesday marks the first day of the 40 days of Lent, a six-week period (excluding Sundays) dedicated to prayer, fasting, and reflection in preparation for the great celebration of Christ's Paschal Mystery in the Easter Triduum. Lent has been described as a time to re-focus and to re-enter a place of truth. It is here where we find our true identity.

Ash Wednesday is the best way to begin a season which calls us into self-examination as well as self-denial, into deeper contemplation about the mystery and grace of God's mercy, and towards more radical giving towards those most in need of comfort, sustenance, and hope.

"Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

Genesis 3:19

The line from Genesis reminds us our lives on this earth won't last forever. We are a finite people who hold hope in something infinite and beyond ourselves. Bearing a mark throughout the day that is visible to others puts an explanation point on the Genesis passage. We become walking witnesses of that place of truth. Heaping ashes upon the head, rending the garment, and donning sackcloth were all outward signs of penitence in biblical times. Such a display was one of abject humility and repentance.

We begin the season of Lent on Ash Wednesday. The ancient practice of Ash Wednesday reminds us that we are mortal. It causes us to pause and look at our lives—remember what we are made of, remember where we are going- and encourages us to fully immerse ourselves in the Lenten season.
