MAY DEVOTION



What is Pentecost? Why does it matter?

Pentecost celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit 40 days after Easter. (Acts 2:1-31) Before the events of the first Pentecost there were followers of Jesus, but no movement that could be meaningfully called "the church." From an historical point of view, Pentecost is the day on which the church was started; from a spiritual perspective, Pentecost is the church's birthday since the Spirit brings the church into

existence and enlivens it.

Liturgical celebrations of Pentecost are rich and varied. A main sign of Pentecost is the color red. It symbolizes joy and the fire of the Holy Spirit. This custom has extended to the congregation wearing red clothing in celebration. Other common symbols of the Holy Spirit are the dove or flames.

On Pentecost, Peter stood up and preached his first sermon. He interpreted the events of that morning in light of Joel's prophecy that God promised to pour out his Spirit on all flesh, empowering diverse people to exercise divine power. This would be a sign of the coming "day of the Lord" (Acts 2:16-21; Joel 2:28-32).

So, then, what difference does it make for us today that the first Christians were filled with the Holy Spirit so long ago on the Jewish festival of Pentecost?

What happened on the first Pentecost continues to happen to Christians throughout the world today, though usually not in such a dramatic fashion. Christians are meant to live in the presence and power of the Spirit of God. The Holy Spirit helps us to confess Jesus as Lord (1 Cor 12:3),), binds us together as the body of Christ (1 Cor 12:12-13), and helps us to pray (Rom 8:26). The Spirit guides us (Gal 5:25), helping us to live like Jesus (Gal 5:22-23).

The Spirit could have been poured out on the followers of Jesus when they were not gathered together. Instead, it was received by the followers of Jesus grouped together. This gathering became the first Christian church. New believers in Jesus were baptized. They, along with the first followers of Jesus, shared life together, focusing on teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread, and prayer. They shared their belongings so that no one was hungry or needy. As these first Christians lived out their new faith together, "the Lord added to their number those who were being saved" (Acts 2:47).

But the fact that the Spirit was given to a gathering of believers is not incidental. It underscores the importance of the church in God's work in the world. Paul observes that the church is God's temple and that the Spirit dwells in the midst of the church.

Pentecost is a vivid illustration of the truth that is found throughout Scripture: the community of God's people is central to God's work in the world. Pentecost invites us to consider our own participation in the fellowship, worship, and mission of the church. It is a time to renew our commitment to live as an essential member of the body of Christ, using our gifts to build the church and share the love and justice of Christ with the world.


Next council meeting is scheduled for Sunday May 6th, 11:30 am

Q (from a member): How is it that some people still dwell in guilt after communion?


Answer: Holding on to guilt is probably the most common problem that results in pastoral counseling. We sometimes seem to be determined to hold on to guilt even after we receive Holy Communion and KNOW our sins are forgiven. I think part of the reason is because we think that by "feeling guilty" and robbing ourselves of peace we are somehow "paying the price" for our sins. Martin Luther did this before he read and studied Romans and God, though His Holy Spirit, "shook him up" and made him realize God's grace is just that – GRACE!! We can do nothing to deserve it or earn it—not even by "beating ourselves up" with guilt (Luther actually flagellated himself!)

God gave us the sacrament of Holy Communion to give us an actual EVENT of forgiveness, a moment, Biblically speaking, when we can KNOW FOR SURE He is not only present but actually forgiving our Pastor Michael sins—the Bible says so!




Tidbits!
