SCRIPTURE LESSONS FIRST LESSON

R. The first lesson is from the book of Isaiah 35: 4-7a:

⁴ Say to those who have an anxious heart, "Be strong; fear not! Behold, your God will come with vengeance, with the recompense of God. He will come and save you." ⁵ Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; ⁶ then shall the

lame man leap like a deer, and the tongue of the mute sing for joy. For waters break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert; ⁷ the burning sand shall become a pool, and the thirsty ground springs of water;

R. This is the word of the Lord *C. Thanks be to God.*

RESPONSIVE PSALM R. The responsive Psalm is Psalm 146:

- R. ¹Praise the LORD! Praise the LORD, O my soul!
- C. ² I will praise the LORD as long as I live; I will sing praises to my God while I have my being.
- R. ³ Put not your trust in princes, in a son of man, in whom there is no salvation.
- C.4 When his breath departs, he returns to the earth; on that very day his plans perish.
- R. ⁵ Blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the LORD his God,
- C. 6 who made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, who keeps faith forever;
- ${\rm R.}^{\,7}$ who executes justice for the oppressed, who gives food to the hungry. The LORD sets the prisoners free;
- C. 8 the LORD opens the eyes of the blind. The LORD lifts up those who are bowed down; the LORD loves the righteous.

GOSPEL LESSON (Please rise as you are able)

P. The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the 7th chapter, verses 24-37:

C. Glory to you, O Lord

²⁴ And from there he arose and went away to the region of Tyre and Sidon. And he entered a house and did not want anyone to know, yet he could not be hidden. ²⁵ But immediately a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit heard of him and came and fell down at his feet. ²⁶ Now the woman was a Gentile, a Syrophoenician by birth. And she begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. ²⁷ And he said to her, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not right to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs." ²⁸ But she answered him, "Yes, Lord; yet even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." ²⁹ And he said to her, "For this statement you may go your way; the demon has left your daughter." ³⁰ And she went home and found the child lying in bed and the demon gone. ³¹ Then he returned from the region of Tyre and went through Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. ³² And they brought to him a man who was deaf and had a speech impediment, and they begged him to lay his hand on him. ³³ And taking him aside from the crowd privately, he put his fingers into his ears, and after spitting touched his tongue. ³⁴ And looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." ³⁵ And his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. ³⁶ And

Jesus charged them to tell no one. But the more he charged them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. ³⁷ And they were astonished beyond measure, saying, "He has done all things well. He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."

NICENE CREED
