Greetings Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Living Word Family!

My apologies for not being as consistent as I have been in providing you with sermon notes and your "To Do List" to "Live the Word". During these transition days I'll be traveling some weekdays but here on Sundays ...

Here goes:

- **1. Please reread and enjoy the grand scale imagery** of the first lesson Job 38: 1-11. The whole lesson is the answer to the question the disciples posed in the last verse (41) of the Gospel Lesson. *Note this also answers OUR concerns when we are tempted to question God and what is doing in our lives!*
- 2. Please pray first, then reread the Gospel Lesson, Mark 4: 35-41.
- **3.** Note the keys to getting through the storms in YOUR life: A) making sure Jesus "comes with you" (vs. 36), B) trusting Jesus "knows what's coming" and trust Him to handle it for you inHis way and His time, C) resist the temptation to doubt Jesus when you are fearful (vs. 38), D) note Jesus words "Peace! Be still!" are not just for the wind and waves they are for the disciples AND US!
- **4. Note that Jesus "calls us to the other side"** --- don't be afraid to follow Him into new callings and beginnings, even though "getting there"may involve a storm or two...Let Him USE your future to build your faith -- ask Him to! Living Word Lutheran Church is being called to a new future now as well. We are making the HUGE leap from a part time ministry to a full time ministry -- from a part time Pastor to a full time Pastor -- It's going to be an exciting adventure in faith and growth!
