Meeting was opened with prayer. Minutes from August meeting approved. New item added to the agenda: Update on Yard Sale.

President's Report: Bob Allison Nothing new to report

Pastor Assistant: Eileen Pressler Pastor will be out of town 9/17 and return 9/28 Special Worship for Sept: 9/9 Homecoming/Reception of New Members. Fellowship meal to follow 9/23 Hymn Sing is planned for worship while Pastor is out of town. She is in need participants and worship leader. Special worship for remaining Sunday's of 2018: 10/28 - Reformation Sunday, 11/18 - Thanksgiving worship and dinner, 12/2 - 1st Sunday in Advent Office 365 software was purchased for annual subscription \$99 year. Worship guide printed covers were implemented on 9/2 the cost \$68.35 quarter, \$274.40 year which is less than what was reported last month. Motion approved to add an additional \$140 from Thrivent Mission for her trip to India. \$250 came in from Thrivent Action Team for the yard sale, this is for advertising, hot dogs, buns etc. Pat Toth will do a Thrivent Action Team for Thanksgiving/Christmas food baskets. Donna Pederson is splanning on submitting Action Team request for Root project.



"Comparing Jesus' words with Paul's, why would Paul ignore what Jesus said to him and the other disciples?"

Compare: Matthew 23:8-12 with 1 Corinthians 4:13-18

We have to allow Jesus the use of hyperbole to make His points.

E.G.: "if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out..." etc. As Luther noted, when we think we see a contradiction or are not sure when its hyperbole or command, "let the text interpret the text". Therefore, we know Jesus isn't prohibiting the categorical use of Father under ANY circumstance, other wise I would be sinning when I called my Dad "father". In the context, Jesus is "calling out" the Jewish leadership for stealing the respect that God deserves and trying to apply it to themselves. Paul, is, on the other hand, if you read the context, actually demonstrating how much he cares for his "charges" (see previous verses list of all he has endured in order to bring the Good News to them). He is tenderly referring to them as his spiritual "children" and Timothy as his son etc., simply because he loves them and desires for them to come to the Gospel, using himself and his life as a "teaching device", if necessary


