#### **SUPER BOWL CHRISTIANS!**

Have you ever wondered what it would be like to play in the Super Bowl? It's a long and tough road to get there, and the two teams that make it have put together a rare combination of hard work, determination, and even a bit of luck! Whether you are a Patriots fan or you prefer Rams, at the end of the day we all just want good commercials and a great game.

Did you realize you are a professional "athlete"? Not in the NFL but in a much greater league. There are some fascinating parallels between the Super Bowl and our time serving Jesus here on earth.

#### #1: Welcome to the Pros!

Yep, you are a professional "athlete," not in the NFL, but in a much greater league that offers an eternal reward that makes winning a trophy look like a free hot dog! Here's the way the Apostle Paul puts it: "<sup>24</sup> Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize. <sup>25</sup> Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last, but we do it to get a crown that will last forever. <sup>26</sup> Therefore I do not run like someone running aimlessly; I do not fight like a boxer beating the air. <sup>27</sup> No, I strike a blow to my body and make it my slave so that after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified for the prize." (1 Cor. 9:24-27)

Could you name the last 52 Super Bowl winners or MVPs? Most people can't! That is Paul's point here. At the time, those folks thought they had reached the pinnacle of victory, and now the majority of people on earth don't even remember their names. But when we see the Christian life as a daily "all in" competition with our selfish and sinful nature, we will achieve a victory and glory for our Father that will never perish or fade! So wake up each morning with a game day mindset. Tell the Lord that you are ready to walk in His power and follow His will wherever it leads.

#### #2: Your Time is Limited!

When you watch the Super Bowl, observe how carefully the quarterback keeps his eyes on the clock. He knows that he has only 60 minutes of playing time to make every play count as much as possible. He knows that when the clock runs out and the whistle blows, he may never have a chance for a Super Bowl victory again. As you think about your walk with Jesus Christ, ponder this directive from God's Word: "15 Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, 16 making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil." (Eph. 5:15-16)

Each day is like the snap of the ball for the Cause of Christ! When you start to envision your walk with Christ as a trained athlete who is racing against the clock to bring glory to God, the Christian life takes on a whole new level of meaning and excitement! Don't be fooled by all the time we seem to have left, because we are in the fourth quarter at the two-minute warning. Each day is like the snap of the ball for THE Cause of Christ, and we must carefully plan out our "plays" before the whistle blows!

So as you munch on goodies and enjoy Super Sunday with your family and friends, take some time to reflect on the reality of your life with Jesus. Realize that you are on a team (the church) that is competing for the ultimate prize and victory! The stakes are eternal, and like the athletes in the game, we must put ourselves into the strict training of prayer, Bible study, fellowship, and sharing the gospel for the sake of Christ and His Cause!

Meeting opened with prayer. November meeting minutes approved. No items to be added to agenda.

<u>President's Report:</u> Nothing to report this month <u>Vice President/Financial Report:</u> November financial report and proposed budget for 2019 of \$ 71,023.00 approved.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor Michael Birnbaum (report on next page) Proposed we consider contracting Pastor Cross for \$3500 to do a congregational assessment. Council would like to keep this in mind for the future. Would like to request a \$5,000 loan. There was a lot of discussion on this issue. Motion made to loan Pastor \$5,000 with explanation at the congregational meeting. Council voted 5 to 1 to approve. Pastor will get with Arlene. This will be a 2 year loan.

**Pastor Assistant:** Pastor is planning to take Feb 10, 2019 off and Pastor Steve Bergeson is scheduled at this time. We could plan a potluck after worship for that Sunday. Candlelight worship is planned for Christmas Eve (6 pm) and Christmas day (10 am) Special services coming up in 2019: Ash Wednesday March 6<sup>th</sup>, Easter April 21<sup>st</sup> Plans for new members class in January. New members will be received before the congregation meeting. 3 Days of Prayer to begin 2019 New visitor cards have been implemented. Anticipate the Church Directory will be emailed in January. Reviewed the constitution and suggested delete 10.7.3 – it conflicts with 10.7.4 Review of the member active voting list.

**Mission Coordinator:** Review was done of projects over 2018. We did 6 food boxes for Thanksgiving and plan on doing another 6 for Christmas.

**New Business:** Candidates for Council Members – 2 positions are ending. Mission Coordinator and Vice President. Rosie agreed to continue another service. Ken will pray about it.

# Pastor's Report for Dec 2018 (Some items may be covered in Parish Admin Report ...)

- --Adding Christmas Day Service at 10 am
- --New member Sunday in Jan.
- --Travel plans: Dec I'm "here", Jan/Feb will be heavy travel (actually starting Dec 28) but I'll be here on Sundays, with the possible exception of a Sunday in late Jan.
- --Out Dec 28 Jan 3, 7-9, Feb. 4-15 (Bergeson preaching Feb 10. More to be announced.
- --Need to increase pastor time either me or Steve B. or?
- --Please recombine my salary with the \$200 I asked to be set aside for "Pastor Expenses—that was a mistake on my part.
- --Would like to request the other \$200 approved at last meeting be given to me. I will report to IRS, not LW.
- --Requesting a \$5,000 loan from LW savings for Pastoral housing, to be repaid with interest via payroll deduction.

# **Designated Fund Policy**

# **Purpose:**

Designated Funds provide an avenue for Living Word Lutheran Church (LWLC) Council to report income and expenses from sources both inside and outside the church membership directed towards specific ministries approved by the Church Council and beyond the constraints of the Church Budget.

# **Policy:**

Before a designated fund is established, the Church Council will determine that it either supports an existing ministry of the church OR supports the overall mission/vision of the Church.

A designated fund may be established for specific items not otherwise included in the budget. They may also be established against an in house ministry and if so the designated funds will be spent BEFORE budgeted monies are spent.

Designated funds may be set up for both in house and/or out of house ministries at the discretion of the Church Council and the designated fund will be spent over and above any Church budgeted amount.

A Designated Fund will be dissolved when the ministry is no longer active OR is absorbed into the Church Budget. Out of house ministries or projects will get closed out on a yearly basis.

All Designated funds will be reviewed on an annual basis by the LWLC Budget Committee, with input from the Church Council if required, at the time of the new yearly budget preparation to determine if the fund is still active and to determine if the fund has fulfilled its objective. If the latter is the case any unused funds will be moved to the general operating budget of the Church to an account determined by the Budget Committee.

LWLC Council retains the right to remove the restrictions on a gift to a designated fund when it is in the best interests of the church to do so.
