

were discussing with each other whether or not they should make the commitment. It wasn't that they didn't want to; instead, they were worried they wouldn't be able to live up to their promise. They were taking the whole matter very seriously and wanted to be sure they would follow through. Would they <u>remember</u> to pray for the missionary family each day? Would they have the time?

What a wonderful privilege to be able to go to God anytime, day or night, in humble, fervent prayer! Jesus set a good example for us as we pray!

Jesus prayed **IN PUBLIC**. He went to the synagogues and participated in public worship. "...not giving up meeting together as some are in the habit of doing" Heb. 10:25 He tells us that where two or three are gathered in His name, He's right there.

Jesus prayed in **PRIVATE.** Jesus loved private prayer.He encourages us: "When you pray, go into your room and close the door and pray to your Father." Matt. 6:6

Jesus' prayer life was **PERSONAL.** As a model, He gave His disciples the Lord's Prayer. Only 70 words but it covers everything!

Jesus was **PERSISTENT** in prayer. Romans 12:12 tells us to be "joyful in hope, patient in affliction and faithful in prayer."

Jesus prayed for His **FRIENDS.** Jesus prayed for us (John 17). Think of it! Jesus, the holy Son of God prays for us.

Jesus prayed for His **ENEMIES**. Jesus prayed for those who mocked Him and even nailed Him to the cross (Luke 23:34) We will soon discover that we cannot continue to hate those for whom we pray. Prayer helps us adjust and cleanse our own hearts.

Prayer-what a beautiful subject to think about! What a privilege to be able to go to Jesus in prayer, anytime, about anything, day or night! What a very special blessing is ours!



President Bob Allison, Pastor Michael Birnbaum, Vice-President Ken Boulier, Treasurer Arlene Allison, Mission Coordinator Rosie Freeman & Secretary Sharon Peterson. Excused Absentee, Pastor Assistant Eileen Pressler

Bob opened the meeting with prayer. Minutes of last meeting approved. There were no new items of business presented to be be included in the agenda.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Michael Birnbaum The new arrangement of chairs (aisle down the middle) seems to be working and has been received well. Trinity Sunday sermon challenged us to 'seek Jesus' and it has reignited more interest in small groups. Two new groups were added, Men's Support Group Thursday 6pm, Women's Support Group (date/time not scheduled yet). The Next group to be formed is any appropriate interest group or Bible study that 6-8 LW members want to start, Pastor will facilitate. Men's & Women's Support Groups also qualify as Cursillo groupings. Donna Ferguson will coordinate Cursillo connections. We are considering what is needed to make us an 'official' Cursillo church. Pastor is very pleased with how attendance appears to be holding strong and we have had visitors regularly. Most of them are staying. He would like to have new members received and is considering September 9th (Homecoming). For now he will use his New Member instruction class as confirmation. Starting this coming Sunday (6/10) we will be integrating the youth in to worship leadership.

Bob Alison receive a LCMC doc that is basically a rehash of an argument at the last LCMC gathering between Trustees and a group of concerned about procedure and authority in the LCMC. This does not affect us. It reaffirms LCMC churches don't have to have LCMC pastors. Pastor has again asked to be removed from the roster, preferring to maintain independent pastor rostering as a missionary. There are others in LCMC-AZ doing the same.

<u>President's Report:</u> Bob Allison_ Bob was very pleased at how the picnic on May 20th went.

<u>Vice President/Financial Report:</u> Arlene Allison/Ken Boulier Reviewed the financial report.

Report was approved by council <u>Mission Coordinator:</u> Rosie Freeman Bunko night went really great.

23 ladies attended. The month of June is designated for the Aide & Pregnancy. Donna Pederson will be doing an Action Team for Root. Pastor will be doing an Action Team later in the year. Pen's with Living Word inscribed were ordered. These will be for a welcome packet and will be done as a Thrivent Action Team.

Church Insurance? Should it be paid quarterly or yearly? Council approved quarterly.


Communications/Suggestion Box:

You may have noticed a little different twist to our potluck on the 29th (Christmas in July). By adding a little time for someone to share their faith and attempting to group and share our time with a "mixer" format we are borrowing from the Ultreya tradition. This tradition of being more intentional about fellowship and sharing personal faith stories in a common meal comes out of the Cursillo Movement. This movement is a spiritual renewal retreat movement with a beautiful Spanish history.

team leader on a Cursillo weekend, we will be using this Ultreya format now and then—it's a good way to "do fellowship". Another Cursillo tradition I am encouraging is the use of weekly "grouping" for men and women as an "accountability group" for **ANYONE** interested in growing your faith in this way. I liken it to a 12 step program for daily Christian living. We will be offering Cursillo weekends for members again and Donna Ferguson will be our coordinator. Do we go immediately to heaven when we die, or ?

The Bible teaches that the souls of those who reject God in this life go to a place of eternal torment and separation from God—which would be the worst punishment of all. The souls of those who have given their lives to God in Christ Jesus and have listened to intently to Pastor Birnbaum's sermons *every Sunday (REALLY???)*, go to a place of eternal blessedness from which we cannot "fall" and is an eternal communion with God and

those others who have died in the faith.

There will be a point in time when God will call an end to human history and we will be reunited with our bodies (a glorified body for those believers) to experience a final judgment which will confirm the reasons our souls went to Heaven or Hell when we died or be an immediate judgment for those still alive when The End comes. (see Luke 23:43; Acts 7:59; Rev. 19:13; Phil. 1:23-24, 1 Cor. 15: 51-52, 2 Cor. 5: 1-8, I Thess. 4: 13-18). References to "sleep" are sometimes metaphors for death as in the account of the resurrection of Jairus' daughter from our sermons last month. Is this "cut and dried" Biblically? Nope. Countless books and articles have been written on this subject with varying interpretations, many of which can be "proof-texted" in the Bible.

This much we know for sure: now is the time to give yourselves to the Lord—all of you! This earthly life is temporary—it is a school, actually. The time God gives us to make our decisions about accepting his invitation of redemption.
