A story of Persistence


Here is a part of the Thanksgiving story you may not know. While letters for 40 the first Thanksgiving was celebrated in October of 1621, it was not until October of 1777 that all 13 colonies celebrated time. At one point, our first president, George Washington, proclaimed a ty years of dedication, National Day of Thanksgiving, but conflict and difficulties among the col- country would celebrate a onies put an end to its observance.

It was a magazine editor, Sarah Josepha Hale, whose work led to the celebration of the Thanksgiving holiday we observe today. Hale wrote letters to governors and presidents, and editorials in magazines, books and newspapers, promoting the observance of Thanks- choose between right and giving. In 1863, after 40 years of letter writing and campaigning (that's not a

typo, she really wrote years), Hale's persistence

paid off and President Abraham Lincoln proclaimed a National Day of Thanksgiving, for the first Thanksgiving. Since then, every president has supported Thanksgiving. Forpersistence and passion, all to make sure that this National Day of Thanksgiving each year. Impressive.

> We can learn from Hale's perseverance. It took her 40 years to accomplish what she set out to do. Just like her story, the Christian faith is often described as a marathon, not a sprint. Each day of our life is another day to wrong, to help someone in need, to read our Bible and pray. As Paul reminds



persevere, to press on. Sometimes it can feel like an unrewarding task. It is hard, but important, to look to God for the BIG-GER plan.

What if Hale had chosen to give up after one year or ten years? Her goal would have been left unfinished. Press on towards the call of Christ! Endure! But be forewarned, just like Sara Josepha Hale, it may take 40 years to see the fruit of your labor!

Think about it:

Are there areas in our lives that require this kind of perseverance?

Dear LW Family,

Understandably, some of our members would like to have a better "feel" for my week-ly/Sunday schedule, particularly our newer members who were not here when Living Word first called me to be your pastor. Here are some basics of our working agreement which has been in place since I came to serve Living Word in 2017. My salary is a half-time salary for an experienced Pastor. This translates to 26 Sundays and 26 weeks "on duty" (out of 52 annually). I currently provide 46 Sundays of worship leading and preaching per year because I feel it doesn't work for a pastor to only lead the church every other Sunday – consistency in "the pulpit" is essential. I will, however, have to begin taking my 26 weeks of "weekdays off" to accommodate my other work with Well Child International, grandkid time, and, at this point in time, visits with my ailing sister. In my weekday absences Eileen Pressler, as Pastoral Assistant maintains a list of pastors "on call" for emergencies. Thanks for your patience! Speaking about

schedules, what a busy time we have in our growing little church this fall! Groups for starting, our attendance is back up over 40 where it was before COVID-19 along with beautiful new First Communion candidates last Sunday, and our church finances are back on track! God is good! Bring a friend this Sunday!

Pastor Michael Birnbaum, Pastor Assistant to defray expenses to come out to King-Eileen Pressler, President Ken Bourlier, Vice-President Bob Pressler, Mission Coordinator Rosie Freeman & Secretary Sharon Peterson.

Meeting opened with prayer. August minutes approved.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Michael Birnbaum Men's retreat is looking good. There are 10 men signed up to attend. Moving to leave LCMC is best for Living Word. Congregational meeting is Wednesday Sept 9th, 2020. Jewish Voice Ministries event with Rabbi Zimmerman, Tuesday of Holy Week, request for funds to publicize and subsidize. \$350 for normal pastor fee and a freewill offering to be taken and given to them. Could be a Thrivent action program. Feel that we need to form a "Future Committee" to study future options for affiliation (to replace LCMC). Pastor had phone meeting with Pastor Lyndon Korhonen, Pres of AFLC. He could visit with us in Nov, early Dec or Jan. He would only ask that we send a gift to the 'presidents travel fund', man.

The RETURN (Sept 26, 2020) Living Word is approved as a host site for simulcast. Currently waiting for schedule for the day. Orders placed for Flags for WOW, also ordered gloves and masks. Motion to pay sales taxes for full order approved. \$100 Gift from Soroptimist in memory of their member Marie LeRoywas received. Acknowledgement letter was sent.

Vice President-Financial Report: Bob Pressler Placed a call with RE-MAX to find out when we could sign the lease. Ordered and received camera from Amazon. Media Fund account still has \$107.75 still available. Sharon createdYou Tube Channel. Reports approved

Mission Coordinator: Rosie Freeman Advice & Aid Pregnancy Center has canceled their Tea. They are planning on doing a silent auction event on Facebook in November. Rosie will contact ROOT to see what the needs are for back to school.

Old Business: American Flag display outside: The Jensen's donated a flag to be mounted on the front side of the church. Ken will mount it and WOW will be in charge of getting someone to put it up and take it down on Sundays and special holidays.
