INVOCATION AND CALL TO WORSHIP (please rise as you are able)

- P: We are called together to worship today in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *C: Amen!*
- P. Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!
- C. Hosanna in the Highest!
- P. The Holy Gospel according to St. John, Chapter 12, Verses 12-16:
- C. Glory to you, O Lord.

¹² The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. ¹³ So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" ¹⁴ And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written, ¹⁵ "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" ¹⁶ His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about him and had been done to him.

The people raise their palm branches

- P. We praise you O God, for redeeming the world through our Savior Jesus Christ. Today He entered the holy city in triumph and was proclaimed messiah and king by those who spread garments and branches along His way.
- C. Bless these branches and we who carry them.
- P. Grant us grace to follow our Lord in the way of the cross, so that joined to His death and resurrection we enter into life with You; through the same Jesus Christ who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. *C. Amen*
- P. Let us go forth in peace, C. In the name of the Lord.
- P. Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!
- C. Hosanna in the Highest!

SONG OF PRAISE "Hosanna in the Highest"

RESPONSIVE CONFESSION (Please rise as you are able)

P. Lord Jesus Christ, when our words and actions reflect a reluctance to confess You publicly as Lord of our lives:

C. Forgive us.

P. When we fear that humbling ourselves would be seen by others as weakness,

C. Forgive us.

P. When we have betrayed Your love for us through our lack of love for You, for others and for ourselves:

C. Forgive us.

P. When we find ourselves glossing over the events of Your passion and death because we look forward to Easter as a time to enjoy holidays and have fun:

C. Forgive us.

P. Lord Jesus Christ, fix Your mind in us;

C. Remake us in Your likeness;

P. Empty us of all that hinders us from following You

C. to where pain and suffering, exploitation and injustice exist.

P. Gracious and loving God, empower us with the Holy Spirit so that our lives continually glorify You and our tongues forever confess Jesus as Lord.

C. This we pray in Jesus' name. Amen.

ASSURANCE OF FORGIVENESS

P. Hear the good news: "Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a slave ...and became obedient to the point of death-even death on a cross." (Philippians 2:6, 7a, 8b) Through His obedience we are freed from whatever sin enslaves us.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

R. The first reading is from the book of Philippians, Chapter 2, verses 5-11:

⁵ Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, ⁷ but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. ⁸ And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. ⁹ Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

R. This is the word of the Lord *C. Thanks be to God.*

RESPONSIVE PSALM R. The responsive Psalm is Psalm 31:9-16:

R. ⁹ Be gracious to me, O LORD, for I am in distress; my eye is wasted from grief; my soul and my body also.

C. ¹⁰ For my life is spent with sorrow, and my years with sighing; my strength fails because of my iniquity, and my bones waste away.

R. ¹¹ Because of all my adversaries I have become a reproach, especially to my neighbors, and an object of dread to my acquaintances; those who see me in the street flee from me.

C. 12 I have been forgotten like one who is dead; I have become like a broken vessel.

R. ¹³ For I hear the whispering of many—terror on every side!—as they scheme together against me, as they plot to take my life.

C. ¹⁴ But I trust in you, O LORD; I say, "You are my God."

R. ¹⁵ My times are in your hand; rescue me from the hand of my enemies and from my persecutors!

C.16 Make your face shine on your servant; save me in your steadfast love!

R. Here ends the reading of the Psalm. Please rise as you are able for the reading of the Gospel.

GOSPEL LESSON (Please rise as you are able)

P. The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark 15: 1-15:

C. Glory to you, O Lord

¹And as soon as it was morning, the chief priests held a consultation with the elders and scribes and the whole council. And they bound Jesus and led him away and delivered him over to Pilate. ² And Pilate asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" And he answered him, "You have said so." ³ And the chief priests accused him of many things. ⁴ And Pilate again asked him, "Have you no answer to make? See how many charges they bring against you." ⁵ But Jesus made no further answer, so that Pilate was amazed. ⁶ Now at the feast he used to release for them one prisoner for whom they asked. ⁷ And among the rebels in prison, who had committed murder in the insurrection, there was a man called Barabbas.

⁸ And the crowd came up and began to ask Pilate to do as he usually did for them. ⁹ And he answered them, saying, "Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?" ¹⁰ For he perceived that it was out of envy that the chief priests had delivered him up. ¹¹ But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release for them Barabbas instead. ¹² And Pilate again said to them, "Then what shall I do with the man you call the King of the Jews?" ¹³ And they cried out again, "Crucify him." ¹⁴ And Pilate said to them, "Why? What evil has he done?" But they shouted all the more, "Crucify him." ¹⁵ So Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released for them Barabbas, and having scourged^[a] Jesus, he delivered him to be crucified.

P. This is the Gospel of the Lord. C. Praise to you, O Christ.
