President Bob Allison, Pastor Michael Birnbaum, Vice-President Ken Boulier, Pastor Assistant Eileen Pressler, Treasurer Arlene Allison, Mission Coordinator Rosie Freeman & Secretary Sharon Peterson.

Ken opened with prayer. Minutes from April meeting approved. Ken asked to add building lease as an agenda item to be discussed under new items.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Michael Birnbaum Pastor reported that along with Bob & Ken the 3 met with Keith, the president of Good Shepard. They had a good conversion on the possibilities of sharing their church building. After the meeting Pastor sent a letter to him which he read. There are plans in the works to have a Homecoming to celebrate our 'Church' on a Sunday in September. This would be to all who have ever attended Living Word. President's Report: Bob Allison_Bob reported on how pleased he was on how our mini retreat at Uptons B&B went last month. It was a great time for our council to work together in planning, reflecting. Gave a shout out to the WOW group for their hand in hosing the KEMA lunch on 4/26. Wallack Ranch Park has been reserved for \$25 for our church picnic on May 20th. Also purchased \$25 Cracker Barrel gift card for the winner of Bingo. He would like to suggest hosting a Bicycle safety rodeo. It would be something that will show parents that we are here and could attract some families to our church. Vice President/Financial Report: Arlene Allison/Ken Boulier Reviewed the financial report. It is now a much cleaner look to the worksheet. A congregation member donated a piggy bank which was full and heavy. After all the coins were rolled and counted \$76 has been donated to the Thrivent Mission Account. Financial report approved.

Mission Coordinator: Rosie Freeman Rosie is looking at how we can help each of our 4 missions we support.

- <u>Cornerstone Mission:</u> Currently we are giving travel soaps, shampoo's, lotions. We will continue doing this thru out the year. At this time there will not be anything extra planned.
- <u>Annie's Attic:</u> Rosie has not talked to them yet. Pastor said he will talk to her to see if there is a special need that we could support.
- Root: They are looking for game equipment (basketballs, etc) also maybe having the basketball court painted. It was suggested that this be done either July or Oct. With leaning towards Oct when the weather is a bit cooler to be painting. Just a reminder we will submit this as a Thrivent Action.
- Advice & Aide Pregnancy Center: They suggested layette items. WOW is sponsoring a Bunco Night on June 1st from 6 to 8 pm at church. The tickets are free but admission is to bring an item listed on the ticket (layette items). This is open to everyone (not just the women). Seed money for this has been received from Thrivent

Rosie also gave each council member a list from Thrivent on 101 different Thrivent Service Projects they support.



Pastor patriciated in the National Day of Prayer held at Kingman City Hall. He will be officiating at Allen-Flores wedding. The mission trip is scheduled for 5/14-18. The next KEMA meeting he will be attending is 5/31 KEMA — Each church will take a month sponsoring Tuesday Morning Prayer, where the church

will be open for morning pray for 1 hour each Tuesday. Council approved for Living Word for the month of August.

<u>Old Business:</u> After discussion, draft of Living Word Wedding Policy approved; will be on church website.Ink Pen's for welcome packets have been ordered. The chamber Ribbon cutting is on hold.

New Business: Discussed revisiting advertising in the Home Town Crier. Would like to see putting the Yard sale in the Crier. Date for the Yard Sale is 9/21-9/22. Council approved 9/9 for our Homecoming Worship Celebration. Suggestion was made that \$152 from the Thrivent Mission be added to the \$48 for Living Stone Mission for the up-coming Mexico trip. Council approved. There was discussion on the upcoming Lease renewal. It was decided that nothing will be done until after Good Shepard has their meeting and respond to Pastors email.


Arts, Crafts, Woodworking, Etc. WE NEED YOU!
