October Devotion-

The Reformation: "Revive Us Again"

More than five hundred years ago this month, Martin Luther nailed 95 theses to the church door in Wittenberg, Germany, and set in motion a movement that rocked Europe. Though many other factors ioined to launch the Protestant Reformation, God used a revival in Luther's heart to start a revival of Chris-tianity in his time.

As we read Psalm 85 we recognize a call for a revival that begins with the Holy Spirit working in individual hearts, bringing a refreshing return to God with passion and zeal. Revival is not a random burst of energy and emotion but is based on truth found in the Bible. For Luther and other

Reformers of the 16th century, the revival that came to be called the **Protestant Reformation** was based on five enduring principles.

True Christian faith is based on Scripture alone, on salvation in *Christ alone*, by *grace alone* and through *faith* alone—and all of this is for *glory to God alone*.

These five points summarize the key principles of the Reformation.

Are these five lasting principles at work in our lives? As we ponder these teachings that were rediscovered long ago, may their truth work in our hearts to strengthen and revive us, making us agents of revival wherever God has placed us.

There were 13 members and guests involved in the many, many steps of preparing the masa mixture, pork filling, and folding the finished product into two different sets of corn husks before Eneida carefully arranged one tamale next to the other, over 180 tamales in all, into two steamer sessions. The women involved will tell you that is the very short version of the 6 hour process. On Sunday morning the tamales were ready to be distributed and sold. After deducting cost of materials, the W.O.W. group donated \$187 to the bake sale held at the church yard sale.

The W.O.W. group is planning to take orders for the Christmas holiday season for church members to purchase tamales, perhaps as gifts for neighbors or friends or a holiday meal. Look for an order

form during November to place your order.

W.O.W. (Women Of the Word) will meet at the church on Saturday, October 19th, from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. for a business meeting to discuss the possible church projects in refurbishing the inside of the church, landscaping in the perimeter of the church parking lot and midweek church services or events. Also, a group will be formed to plan an evening Thanksgiving service with a pie fellowship. We will also have a guest speaker who will tell us about her call from the Lord to serve Him through Hurricane Harvey. All women who attend Living Word are encouraged to join us.
