Pat Toth and Senior Corps Volunteers

In April, Pat Toth was the guest speaker at the monthly Senior Corps meeting of Foster Grandparents and Senior Companions. Her presentation was titled "How to Help Others without Spending Money." Senior Corps volunteers listened attentively and several even offered additional ideas.

In July, Heather Brassil, Senior Corps' Mohave and La Paz County Coordinator, surprised Pat with the news that the volunteers had donated a dozen pair of used eye glasses, a bag full of plastic grocery bags, and a 13-gallon bag filled with plastic bottle caps. Pat gave the glasses to the local chapter of the Lion's Club, and brought the plastic bags and bottle caps to church to add to our donations to Living Stones Mission.

Charlene Duffy, Assistant Director of the Advice and Aid Pregnancy Center is a Senior Corps volunteer who attended April's presentation. She put a small container near the Center's reception window to collect plastic bottle caps. Within a few days, they needed to upgrade to a larger container. Both the Pregnancy Center's staff and clients love helping children with cancer so much they've decided the large container will be an ongoing feature at the Center.

People wanted to know more so Heather and Pat asked Pastor Michael and Eneida to attend the July meeting. Eneida explained how the plastic bottle caps they would have trashed will now be turned into chemotherapy treatments for children with cancer.

Pat Toth has arranged several ways to advertise the sale beginning a couple of weeks in advance. Eileen Pressler talked about her ideas for the bake sale to include breakfast and snack items, wrapped in multiples, along with desserts, with an emphasis on the display. Everyone was encouraged to accumulate as many goods as possible to donate to the sale.

- Refreshing of the interior of the church with cleaning, new paint,



flooring in the sanctuary, perhaps lighting changes and other decor. Karen Shaffer and Pat Toth will work together on suggestions.

The groups were asked to compile the information on these projects to bring back to WOW at the November meeting to be discussed.

Here is a quick look at one of the services provided to our community by Cornerstone, one of the local missions supported by Living Word:

Cornerstone Mission is a 30 bed shelter for men. Diana's Faith House is a 10 bed shelter for women and women with children. Both programs are up to 90 days. You need to be self-sufficient and want to get up and out of homelessness for this program. We take you from homelessness to housed in the 90 days or less if you obtain income/employment

or less if you obtain income/ employment, continue to move forward through case management and actively participate in our 90 day program.
