SCRIPTURE LESSONS FIRST LESSON

R. The first lesson is from the book of Acts chapter 1, verses 15-17, 21-26:

¹⁵ In those days Peter stood up among the brothers (the company of persons was in all about 120) and said, ¹⁶ "Brothers, the Scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit spoke beforehand by the mouth of David concerning Judas, who became a guide to those who arrested Jesus. ¹⁷ For he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry." ²¹ So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord

Jesus went in and out among us, ²² beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these men must become with us a witness to his resurrection." ²³ And they put forward two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also called Justus, and Matthias. ²⁴ And they prayed and said, "You, Lord, who know the hearts of all, show which one of these two you have chosen ²⁵ to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place." ²⁶ And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias, and he was numbered with the eleven apostles.

R. This is the word of the Lord *C. Thanks be to God.*

RESPONSIVE PSALM R. The responsive Psalm is Psalm 8:

- R. ¹O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory above the heavens.
- C. ² Out of the mouth of babies and infants, you have established strength because of your foes, to still the enemy and the avenger.
- R. ³ When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place,
- C. 4 what is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him?
- R. ⁵ Yet you have made him a little lower than the heavenly beings and crowned him with glory and honor.
- C. ⁶ You have given him dominion over the works of your hands; you have put all things under his feet,
- R. ⁷ all sheep and oxen, and also the beasts of the field,
- C. 8 the birds of the heavens, and the fish of the sea, whatever passes along the paths of the seas.
- R. ⁹O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!
- R. Here ends the reading of the Psalm. Please rise as you are able for the reading of the Gospel.

GOSPEL LESSON Please rise as you are able)

P. The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the 15th chapter, verses 9-17:

C. Glory to you, O Lord.

⁹ As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. ¹⁰ If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. ¹¹ These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full. ¹² "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. ¹³ Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. ¹⁴ You are my friends if you do what I command you. ¹⁵ No longer do I call you servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you. ¹⁶ You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that

your fruit should abide, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you. ¹⁷ These things I command you, so that you will love one another.

P. This is the Gospel of the Lord. C. Praise to you, O Christ.

NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

I believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through Him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven; by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. I acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins. I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
