ARE YOU LISTENING??



I was standing across the counter from the lady at the hole -in-the-wall dry cleaners and I was getting irritated. She had lost my pants and I was sure of it. In broken English, the woman kept insisting that I hadn't dropped them off with my suit jacket. "Ma'am, I wouldn't have just brought in a suit jacket," I said. "Can't you just check to see if there are some navy blue

pants lying around somewhere?"

She grew more defensive and said that she was positive I didn't bring in any pants because she always double checks people's orders. She probably loses people's clothes all the time, I thought. She went to check one more time and I stopped and thought through the last time I had seen them. When she returned empty-handed, I had an idea. "Hold on a second," I said nervously. "I need to call my wife."

I called my wife and asked her to look in the drawer where I normally put the dirty dry cleaning. Then I waited. My wife got back on the phone. "Yeah, you've got some navy blue pants in here," she said. I got off the phone and sheepishly said, "Ma'am, I'm really sorry. They're at my house."

It's not the first time I've unjustly made negative assumptions. There was the time I got annoyed with the barista who ignored me when I spoke to him from behind. When he finally turned around and started talking, I realized he was deaf.

And let's not forget how remarkably rude the cashier was on Christmas Eve at the Hallmark store. It was so bad that when I came back in a couple of months later, I mentioned it to the manager. Her polite response caught me off guard. "I know exactly who you're talking about, sir, and I'll just say this: You never know what people are going through."

She was right. I didn't have any idea, yet I'm still prone to give myself permission to read people's minds, project motives and make assumptions with very little information.

James 1:19 says, "You must all be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to get angry." But in moments when we're convinced we're right, we do just the opposite: We're slow to listen, quick to speak and quick to get angry. And when we do that, it says a lot more about us than the person we're judging.

We apparently think we don't need to slow down and check our assumptions. We're so wise and knowledgeable that we're unwilling to give the thing we need: a little bit of grace, which people need regardless of whether our assumptions are right.

I once had a coworker who was always ascribing wrong motives to people and it irritated me. Finally one day I said, "You know what? I bet that nine out of ten times you're right about people's motives. But the one time out of ten you're wrong makes it not worth it."

10/28-REFORMATION SUNDAY WORSHIP-WEAR YOUR RED SHIRTS!



Reformation Day is celebrated to varying degrees by all protestant churches since the birth of most denominations trace back to this pivotal event in history. Lutherans mark the event as a major celebration and it's officially referred to as **The Festival of the Reformation**. Until the 20th century, most Lutheran churches celebrated Reformation Day on October 31, regardless of which day of the week it occurred. Today, most Lutheran churches transfer the festival, so that it falls on the Sunday (called **Reformation Sunday**) on or before October 31 and transfer All Saints' Day to the Sunday on or after November 1.

The liturgical color of the day is red, which represents the Holy Spirit and the Martyrs of the Christian Church. Luther's hymn, "Ein feste Burg ist unser Gott" ("A Mighty Fortress is our God"), a paraphrase of Psalm 46, is traditionally sung on this day. The fact

that Reformation Day coincides with Halloween is not mere coincidence. Halloween, being the Eve of All Saints' Day, might have been an entirely appropriate day for Luther to post his Ninety-five Theses against indulgences since the Catholic church would be open on All Saints' Day specifically for people to view a large collection of relics. The viewing of these relics was said to promise a reduction in time in purgatory similar to that of the purchase of an indulgence. We miss the true significance of this day however, if we see it only as a past event and fail to heed the call **for continous reformation**: reexamining our present day church's teaching and practice in light of the three great "battle cries" of Luther's day:

Faith alone, Grace alone, Word alone! Here we stand!!

Join us for worship on Sunday, October 28 as we honor Reformation Day and Martin Luther. Be sure to wear your red shirt **and BRING A FRIEND!**


<u>Mission Coordinator</u>: Rosie Freeman Rosie received \$250.00 credit card from Thrivent Actions. This is for Missions outreach. Rosie will get with Pastor so he can give this to MaryAnn who will be placing an order for personalized pens. These pens will go into the gift baskets. September is a busy month with the Yard sale, Homecoming (Pastor is doing Thrivent Action Team Request) and Tea for Aide & Pregnancy.

Pastor Assistant: Eileen Pressler Pastor will be off on 8/12 Todd Ormsby will be our worship leader. Message will be a video by Max Lucado "Before Amen, The power of a simple prayer" Easter in August is planned for 8/26. Pastor is adding 9/23 as his last day off for 2018. Office 365 software has been purchased, it will be renewed annually at a cost of \$109.34 yearly. Eileen had samples of worship guide covers that they are interested in purchasing. The cost is less than \$300 a quarter (approx. \$1,200 per year) During the time Pastor will be away (8/9-8/16) Joel Anderson will cover pastoral duties. Meals on Wheels will be coordinated by Char Matheny & Rosie Freeman with many wow volunteers to help and provide meals for members of our congregation when needed. There has been a request to have a prayer room set up after worship. Eileen will talk to Donna Pederson & Mary Ann Mallory to see what they would like to see or what their need would be.

Old business: Good Shepherd discussion: Their church will be having a congregation meeting soon. They are currently being served by an interim Pastor. Attendance is declining and there has been discussion of closing. Renewal of Pastor's contract call: Reviewed by Council and Pastor. Pastor requests addition of phrase "Contract Call is re-negotiable by request from either party with 30 day prior written notice" Council approved this change. When contract is corrected, it will be signed by Pastor Michael and Bob Allison. Autopay discussion: Arlene checked with our bank. If anyone wishes to have an auto-payment set up for church offering Arlene will be available to tell them how to set it up.
