March Devotion-

Getting Ready for Easter!!

We all have different ways we prepare for different things. How should we prepare for Easter? Maybe you haven't given that much thought.

We do a GREAT job of preparing for Christmas! There are signs everywhere that something special is going to happen. We hang wreaths, trim the tree, wrap gifts, and bake cookies! But Easter? What do you do? If you're a real fanatic, you dye a few eggs and buy a new outfit and BAM! You're done!

For Christians, Easter is the most important day of the year. . . or it should be. It's the day we celebrate the central event of history, the day Jesus rose from the dead in order to make eternal life possible for us.

Of course, for centuries, Christians have prepared for Easter by observing Lent, a period that begins on Ash Wednesday and concludes with Easter. Traditionally, many people prepare for Easter by making this a period of repentance, denying themselves a particular pleasure or taking on a new task of service during this time. At Living Word, we bury the "Alleluias" and we have special mid-week devotions.

This year Pastor Michael is challenging us



to REFOCUS our lives on Jesus!

Here are 3 ways to help us meet that challenge:

1. Do what Jesus says

(Luke 19:29-40) Look at the first part of the Palm Sunday story. The Bible doesn't tell us which two disciples went to get the colt. Peter and Andrew? James and John? Or what they talked about on the way. "Do you really think we should just untie the colt and take it?" They simply did what Jesus said to do. And look at the result. Their simple obedience brought glory to God.

2. Feel what Jesus feels

(Luke 19:41-44) Look at the next part of the Palm Sunday story: Something happened on the ride into Jerusalem that many of us miss. Matthew didn't record it. Mark didn't mention it. Luke is the only Gospel writer who records this event. As Jesus approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it (Luke 19:43). Not for himself; not for the cross that awaited him. But for the fate that would come upon that city. Prepare for Resurrection Sunday by letting yourself feel what Jesus feels, by letting your heart be broken for those who are hurting,

those who are searching. Someone who hasn't yet experienced the forgiveness, the peace and freedom that comes when you experience new life through faith in Jesus Christ.

3. Tell who Jesus is

(Matthew 21:10-11) Look at the conclusion of the Palm Sunday story; When Jesus entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred and asked. "Who is this?" The crowds answered, "This is Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee" (Matthew 21:10-11). Is there someone around you who is sincerely wondering "Who is this?" Surveys indicate many people who don't attend church give the same reason when they're asked why. "No one ever asked." Find that person . . . and invite him or her to be your guest to come with you to midweek devotions; to Lenten Sunday worship in person or on our Facebook page; to special Holy Week services or to a joyous Easter morning worship!

Fellow members of Living Word,

As permitted by article 9.2 of the Living Word Constitution, I will be calling a special congregational meeting to be held immediately after worship on March 7, 2021. As you know, when a special meeting is called, the only items open for discussion are specifically listed on the agenda.



The agenda will be:

- 1. Constitutional Amendment for clarification:
 - 2.3 LWLC may choose to affiliate with one or more associations by a vote of 60% of the voting membership majority vote of those voting members present and voting or maintain an independent status.
- 2. Acceptance of affiliation with Association of Free Lutheran Congregations (AFLC)
- 3. Acceptance of gift of Donna Kowalske's home

As specified in article 6.3.6 of Living Word Constitution and Bylaws, the congregation may "Acquire real and personal property by gift, devise, purchase, or other lawful means." Pastor Michael and I visited Donna Kowalske's home with Kari Hill. Kari, as executor of Donna's estate, is anticipating donating the home to Living Word as a gift from Donna. It is a fully furnished 2 bedroom, 2 bath home located at 976 Shadow Crest Way. Acceptance of this gift would be an asset to our congregation.

Pastor opened with prayer. December Minutes approved.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Michael Birnbaum (full report attached) Will be out of town Feb 1-12, Brandon will be covering on Sunday Feb 7. Brandon has offered to meet with media team on Sat Feb 6. Recommend that council invite Brandon to a Pastoral Position interview. upon congregational approval. Eileen and Sharon will get an email ready to send to him. Recommending a year of transition, adding to the congregational meeting of his preference to retire this year. Would like to recommend establishing a Memorial Fund in honor of members recently lost. Council Approved. Ash Wednesday is Feb 17. If the decision is made to have midweek Lenten services, there will be a need to have someone lead March 10 & 17. Requesting to have March 14 off. Discussion on 1099's. Motion approved to have local CPA prepare the 1099's this year, to help relieve Cherie at this time

Pastor's compensated Sundays off in 2021: 1/3/21 & 2/7/21 Dan Storvick covered on 1/3 and Brandon is confirmed to cover on 2/7. Due to Covid concerns, we are going back to pre-filled communion cups. Review was done of the voting members list. Numbered offering envelopes began 1/3/2021. Will be working on 2020 statements of giving. Contacted Donna Ferguson on doing audit for 2020. Pat Toth will be updating Living Word Membership Directory.

<u>Vice President-Financial Report:</u> Bob Pressler (full report attached)
Council reviewed all reports. New Budget for 2021 is currently being worked on, review was made of the status. Council approved.

Mission Coordinator: Rosie Freeman 10 Christmas Food Baskets were prepared and delivered. Everything else has been canceled due to Covid concerns. Review was done of her yearly report. She has spoken to Sandy at Root. They are currently closed. Motion approved to discon-

tinue funding them until further notice. This will be re-evaluated at each council meeting.

<u>Old Business:</u> Media Team – we will be meeting with Brandon while he is here Feb 6th. Pastor Contract Renewal was reviewed and signed by Pastor & Bob Pressler and Pastor Michael,

New Business: Council positions open for election: Vice-President & Mission Coordinator Review was made of the Constitution and changes that should be presented at the congregational meeting. Council discussed and approved starting the processing to apply for AFLC affiliation.

Next meeting February 15, 2021 at 6:00 pm Meeting was closed with Lord's Prayer.
